Hello and Welcome to East Torrens Primary School, Intensive English Language Program (IELP). This will be an exciting term as we have both Ms Kirsty and Ms Virginia team teaching in M10. Two teachers will allow explicit teaching according to your child's needs and ability. On Tuesday, Ms Kirsty will be taking Health and PE, so we will have Ms Olsson working with

We are all looking forward to teaching your child this year.

The first week of school will be busy as we establish our classroom routine and expections, introducing our schools values of Respect, Excellence, **Empathy** and **Community** to develop a supportive classroom community to assist our learning.

Term 1 Overview:

English Language and Literacy will be our main focus in our lessons to further develop students English language vocabulary, writing structures and communication skills.

Our topic for this term is 'Me and My Family'. Children will be engaging in a wide range of vocabulary to describe and explore more about themselves and their families.

In **English**, we will be learning the purpose, structure and language features of a recount and a description. We will be looking at different examples of writing and construct examples of spoken and written work collaboratively and independently.

Our Spelling program includes Jolly Phonics, Words their Way and Oxford Sight Words. These are used to teach letter sounds, names, digraphs, phonics, vocabulary and spelling rules to support students writing and reading. Words will vary according to student's individual needs. The **Grammar** focus will be linked closely to our theme, expanding on grammar knowledge of common nouns, proper nouns, pronouns, verbs, adjectives and circumstances of place and time.

Children will be involved in **Guided Reading** in small groups. Strategies to develop reading, comprehension and fluency will be explicitly taught. We will also visit the library once a week for children to borrow from a range of books.



In **Mathematics**, we will explore the concepts of number, patterning and place value, with the focus on the mathematical language and processes of counting and calculating.

We focus on fostering children's social and emotional learning to build their character and confidence. Discussions about friendship, safety, rights and responsibilities will be part of our **Child Protection** Curriculum.

Library – We will visit the library once a week for children to borrow from a range of books. Please ensure your child is returning their library book each Thursday so they can borrow new ones.

Communication – We will be communicating via *ClassDojo* in M10 to share your child's learning and any important class information.
