This term we will continue to have Ms Olsson supporting us in M10, this allows us to continue with some explicit teaching and extension according to your child's needs and ability.

Dear Families.

Welcome back to Term 4, I hope you all had an enjoyable break. This is the final term of the year and it is going to be a busy one with lots of exciting learning and activities.

#### Term 4 Overview:

Our topic for this term is 'Celebrations around the World'. Children will explore different festivals and celebrations in Australia as well as other countries.

English Language and Literacy will be our main focus in our lessons to further develop students English language vocabulary, writing structures and communication skills.

In English, we will be learning the purpose and structure of a Narrative and the skills and language of retelling a story. We will be studying a variety of narratives including 'Traditional Tales' and stories from some famous Australian authors such as Mem Fox and Pamela Allen.

We will continue to use *Jolly Phonics* and *Words their Way* in our Spelling program to further their spelling strategies and understanding of spelling rules.

Strategies to develop reading, comprehension and fluency will be explicitly taught through Guided Reading.

In Mathematics, we will continue to explore the concepts of number, patterning and place value, with the focus on the mathematical language and processes of counting and calculating.

This term our class will continue to foster children's social and emotional learning and build their character and confidence. There will also be discussions of friendship, safety, rights and responsibilities as part of the Child Protection Curriculum.
