

Italian Overview – Term 4 2020

Dear Families,

Welcome back to Term 4! I hope you enjoyed your holidays. Below is short outline of what each class will be learning about this term in Italian.

H22, H23 & M4 – Reception & R/1

H22 and H23 will continue to play different Italian games. They will also learn how to talk about their favourite hobbies in Italian. We will conclude the term with learning about 'Natale' and 'La Befana' – making different related crafts.

M1 – Junior Primary Special Needs Class

M1 will watch and listen to stories in Italian and build on the language and hand gestures they have been developing over the course of the year. They will also learn about 'La Befana' through stories and songs.

M3 & M3a – Years R/1, 1/2 & 2

Students will continue to create their pizza game which has been supporting them to learn the names of foods and colours in Italian. They will then learn about 'Natale' and 'La Befana' through stories and songs and will make different related crafts.

M2, C21 – Years 3 & 3/4

M2 and C21 have been working on creating a combined class picture book which features what activities they enjoy doing in different seasons of the year. Once completed, they will read the book to their buddy classes. We will conclude the term learning about 'Natale' and 'La Befana' through videos, stories and games.

C19 & C20 – Year 4/5

C19 and C20 will have the opportunity to present their posters they created last term to the class. They will continue to learn about how to talk about what they like to do in their free time and will be creating a short role play to develop their oral language skills and pronunciation of topic specific words and phrases.

R15 – Primary Special Needs Class

R15 will continue to play different Italian games and how to talk about what their favourite hobbies are. Towards the end of the term, they will be learning about 'Natale' and 'La Befana' through songs and stories as well as making crafts.

R17, R12 & R13 – Years 5/6 & 6/7

The upper primary classes will be creating their own 'Kahoot' which will feature questions, in Italian, related to the topic of hobbies. They will each have the opportunity to present this to their class and test their classmates' knowledge! We will conclude the term learning about 'Natale' and how this is celebrated in Italy, comparing it to other celebrations in our own and other cultures.
