School Improvement Plan

The Department for Education is focused on creating a system where every child receives the education they need to learn and thrive. Schools develop and implement a School Improvement Plan (SIP) that identifies targets, actions and outcomes that are designed to maximise learner engagement, agency and improvement.

One aspect of the Areas of Impact is Wellbeing. At ETPS, our learners feel safe, included and valued. They have access to support, experiences, teaching, and resources to build their resilience and social and emotional skills to positively and confidently engage in learning. We build strong relationships with students and they have a sense of belonging to the school which supports their cognitive engagement. They are comfortable to be challenged with their learning.

Another aspect of the Areas of Impact which is being supported through our SIP is Learner Agency. At ETPS, our learners are empowered to develop a sense of identity and responsibility as they participate in their school community and are supported to play a role in shaping their learning experiences. As SRC reps, they are developing an ownership over aspects of learning, attendance and the environment. Teaching strategies encourage independent learning, reflection and goal setting.

This year, we continue with our focus on Writing and Mathematics development while ensuring student wellbeing and agency are featured and the areas of Equity and Excellence and Effective Learners are embedded in our teaching practice.

To support this next stage of the improvement cycle, we use our staff meeting training and development time and Pupil Free Days. The Term 1 Pupil Free Day focused on teacher moderation of student writing and building the next steps in writing development with students. Students will be supported to develop writing goals with the teacher and work toward achieving their goals.

NAPLAN

This year, NAPLAN will be held from 13 to 25 March 2024 (Weeks 7 to 9, Term 1) for students in the mainstream Year 3 and 5 classes. Families do not need to do any additional work to prepare their child for NAPLAN as school staff are ensuring that the students are familiar with the format and expectations of testing. The students will complete a practice test on the 27th February in further preparation for the formal testing to follow. Should you have any questions or concerns about the NAPLAN tests, please contact a member of the leadership team.



CHILDREN'S UNIVERSITY

East Torrens will once again be participating in the Children's University led by the Adelaide University. Although the program is available from age 5-14 years, we are offering the program for students in Year 3-6 only.

The Children's University allows students to receive hours for learning done outside of school as well as lunchtime and after school activities. There are also online activities that students can participate in.

Membership into the program is \$16.50 for each child. This fee covers the passport members receive to record the hours they have completed. It also gives them access to an online portal where they will find many different learning opportunities they can access including some of which are free of charge. Lastly the fee covers the costs of the graduation ceremony that students participate in if they achieve a minimum of 30 hours or more. Children who have participated in the program before may continue to do so this year, however they will need to pay for another passport if they have theirs. This will cost \$7.70.

If you are interested in your children becoming members of the Children's University program click on the QR code below and it will take you to the registration page.

Once you have registered your children, the payment can be made directly to the school, at the Front Office. All payments and membership forms must be received by Friday March 22nd. (Week 9)

Please note no late registrations or payments can be received after the due date.

Welcome all to Sporting News for 2024. In Term 1, your child may be eligible to choose from a numerous range of sporting opportunities, both during and after-school hours.

Lunch-time activities include indoor soccer, Wheels Wednesday and boys' SAPSASA soccer training (unfortunately due to lack of interest there will not be a SAPSASA knock-out team for girls soccer or netball)

Year 1 to 3 boys can take part in the Monday lunchtime indoor soccer competition. This is a fun program that has friends playing with and against each other building towards the Week 11 finals. Year 1 to 3 girls can participate in the same style program each Tuesday at lunchtime. Each team comprises children from both mainstream and IELP classes. Year 4 to 6 boys and girls participate in a mixedgender indoor soccer competition each Friday at lunch-time. Premiership tables are generated each round so that participants can track the progress of their team before the finals.

Wheels Wednesday is a very popular program where up to twenty children can sign up, outside Ms Piro's office, and have fun at lunch riding bicycles, skateboards and scooters. Children are also welcome to bring their own bike from home if they choose.

SAPSASA boys' soccer training will begin mid-term on Thursday lunchtimes for the Year 5/6 students. With limited numbers for a squad the children will train hard to try to make the team. Good luck boys.

After-school activities include basketball and lacrosse this term.

Year 3 and 4 students, who are interested in learning and playing basketball, can sign up for regular practice sessions each Monday afternoon, from 3 to 4:00pm. The emphasis is on the enjoyment of the game and learning and refining skills in competitive games. Year 5 and 6 students are able to train regularly on Wednesday afternoons until 4:00pm. Children are encouraged to be positive team members and take risks in small games, with other children using varied skills and experience.

Year 4, 5 and 6 students are welcome to come and try the exciting sport of lacrosse, with the goal of competing in the Week 10 SAPSASA carnival. The weekly **Thursday sessions** begin in Week 5, with coaches from the Burnside Lacrosse Club.
