



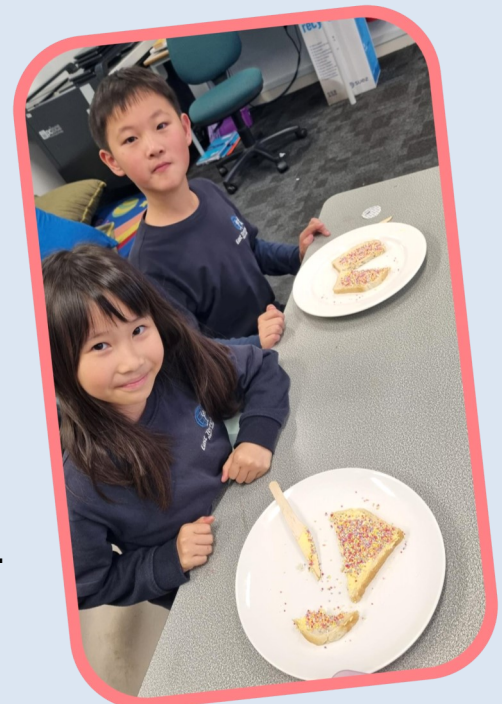
M3A Making Fairy Bread

Dear Parents,

Facilities

You may have noticed that the new fence around the OSHC carpark has now been completed with secure gates and a higher fence. This will support safer movement of the students around the school grounds. Plans are underway to replace the two playgrounds next to gym. We have some initial plans which we will share with the SRC representatives for feedback before proceeding with the works. The playgrounds will be installed before the end of the year.

Site Improvement Plan

Forming part of our work on developing the mathematics learning of our students, teachers have been using visible learning prompts in classes. These have included maths word walls where the correct maths terminology is displayed and referred to and anchor charts which provide maths learning prompts to the students. As a staff, we are continuing the professional development sessions with the Primary Mathematics Association to develop planning and teaching strategies to ensure consistent language and processes are used across year levels.

Teachers are currently working on the moderation of student writing samples which will give them information about the areas of writing that individual and groups of children need to work on next and forms part of the writing goal setting for students.

Teachers are also engaged in writing their students' mid-year reports. These will be sent home to parents in Week 10 of this term.

Congratulations to the students who represented the school playing in the half time break at the Rugby State of Origin game last week. They displayed excellent behaviour and courage to play in front of a very large crowd. We are all very proud of their achievements. Thank you to Mr Richard Thom, our PE teacher, for organising the various rugby events and supporting the students.

Hello from the Nest.

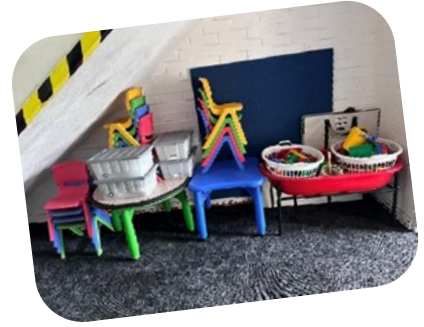

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East Torrens Goes To The State Of Origin

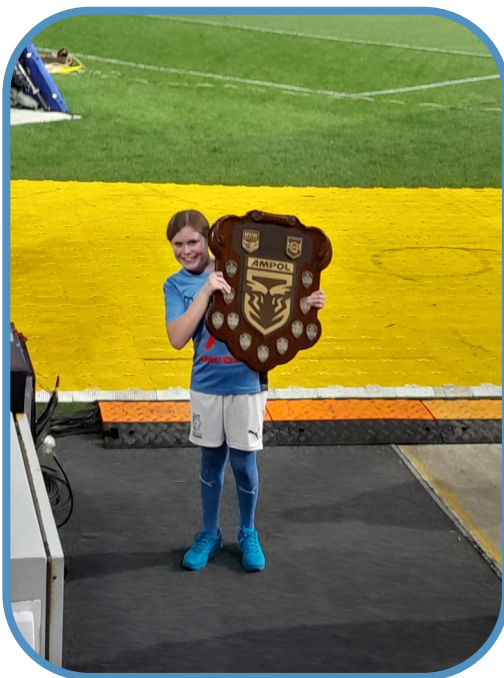
