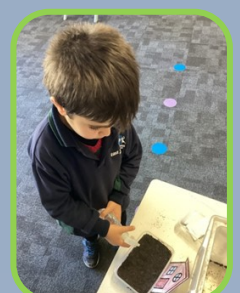

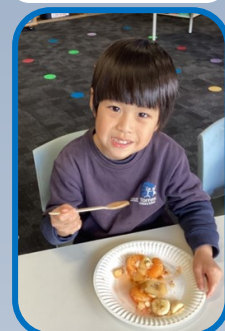

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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents,

The end of Term 2 is approaching quickly. Mid-year reports for students in mainstream and special classes will go home late next week. If you have any questions related to the reports, please make a time to speak to the class teacher.



Next term, we welcome the new mid-year intake of Reception students. This is the first time in many years that children start school at times other than the beginning of the year. These students will join the students in H22 or H23 and have a total of six terms of Reception before progressing to Year 1. If you have a child who is due to start school next year, please visit our website and complete the [Registration of Interest](#) form to start the enrolment processes.

Supporting your child to be a confident user of mathematics

Confidence in mathematics enhances critical thinking and problem solving skills which are vital for navigating a world increasingly driven by technology and data. Ways in which parents can support their children to develop confidence and resilience with mathematics:

Remember to be positive about mathematics

- Let your child know that everyone can learn mathematics
- Let your child know that you think mathematics is important and fun
- Point out the ways in which different family members use mathematics in their jobs and at home and play
- Encourage your child to be persistent if a mathematical situation seems difficult to resolve.

Include your child in everyday activities that involve mathematics

- Making purchases
- Measuring ingredients
- Counting out plates and utensils for dinner
- Playing games and doing puzzles with your child that involve mathematics. They may focus on direction or time, logic and reasoning, sorting or estimating

Encourage your child to give explanations

- When your child is trying to solve a situation, ask what he or she is thinking. If your child seems puzzled, ask him or her to tell you what doesn't make sense. (talking about their ideas and how they reach solutions helps children to reason mathematically)
- Suggest that your child act out a situation to solve it. Have your child show how he or she reached a conclusion by drawing pictures and moving objects as well as using words
- Treat errors as opportunities to help your child learn something new.

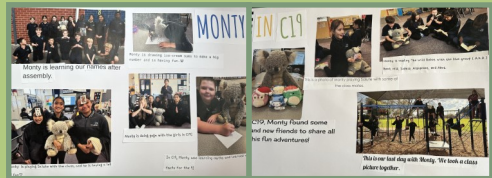
