Dear Parents,

### School Improvement Plan

The Department for Education aims to build a high performing system where every child and young person learns and thrives. As part of this process, each school develops and implements a School Improvement Plan that identifies targets, actions and outcomes that are designed to maximise learner achievement.

The next stage of our School Improvement Plan has begun for 2026. We will continue with our focus on Mathematics and Technologies with the goals of extending student learning to achieve improved results and student agency in their learning.

To support this next stage of the improvement cycle, we use our after-school staff meeting times and Pupil Free Days for professional development for staff and team planning and moderation of learning. The Term 1 Pupil Free Day will focus on the SA Curriculum Technologies and STEM learning. The Term 2 Pupil Free Day will focus on mathematics planning and teaching strategies using the SA Curriculum – Mathematics document and resources.


## Colour Run

## NAPLAN 2026 – Years 3 and 5

NAPLAN is a national test conducted annually for students in Years 3 and 5.

NAPLAN tests are completed nationally online, except for Year 3 writing which is paper based. Small numbers of students may use alternative test formats, such as paper or special print materials.

NAPLAN this year is from Wednesday 11 March until Monday 23 March 2026 (weeks 7-8).

Year 3 writing tests will be conducted using paper test books on Wednesday 11 March 2026.

Schools participate in readiness activities before the main NAPLAN test. The purpose of the readiness activities is to familiarise students with the test format, question types and the online testing experience and for schools to confirm they are ready to administer NAPLAN.

As the State's Test Administration Authority, the Department for Education is required by law to collect and use personal information about student(s) and their parents/carers through each participating school, for the purpose of administering and delivering the NAPLAN test. Welcome back to what I hope to be an amazing year, and a special welcome to our new families. I hope you have all had a relaxing and enjoyable break and are just as excited for the year ahead as I am!

For those who don't know me, my name is Lisa and my role at the school is the pastoral care worker. I am based in the nest and my job is to provide support for all students, families and staff in our school, whether it be in class support, or practical support such as food hampers. It is such a joy to be able to connect and help the families of East Torrens, so please do not hesitate to reach out if you need anything.

Another fun aspect of my job is teaching Kimochis to the receptions and doing refresher classes to the older kids. So what are Kimochis? Kimochi (KEY.MO.CHEE) means "feeling" in Japanese. We have 7 Kimochis; Lovey dove, Huggtopus, Cat, Bug, Bella rose and Cloud. These Kimochis help to understand how to process and handle our feelings and emotions as sometimes kids have strong feelings that can fuel challenging behaviours. Sometimes it's hard to know how to communicate when you are in an emotional moment. Kimochis are a playful way to help children learn how to identify and express feelings. When kids can communicate their feelings effectively, they develop positive social skills that lead to lasting friendships and success in all aspects of life.

I also have the privilege of running our playgroup on a Wednesday morning from 9-10.30. We have loads of fun, from doing activities to singing songs, reading books and having fruit, all children from ages 0- school age are welcome, we would love to see you there!!
